

#### **DEAR SUPPORTERS,**

We are thrilled to share the highlights of our impactful 2022-23 Fiscal Year at The Street Trust. It's been a year of growth in every direction, especially in our focus areas of advocacy, partnerships, community, equity, and safety.

In the last few years, Oregon has experienced the nation's third highest spike in traffic fatalities while Portland broke multiple traffic death records. We knew it was time to act. Over the past year, we expanded our safety programs, offering 17 classes and 24 community events to over 450 community members promoting safe cycling. We also conducted 15 Oregon Friendly Driver classes, reaching 120 Driver's Education instructors to encourage safer driving habits.

We also doubled-down on advocacy efforts, including shaping updates to the Oregon Transportation Plan and Metro's 2023 Regional Transportation Plan. We held community listening sessions to elevate the voices of those most underserved by our current transportation system to secure outcomes that improve people's everyday lives. From tiny street plazas to massive Interstate Bridge Replacement Project, we organized communities in innovative - and often joyful - ways to grow power and influence to shift the tide away from our deadly, unsustainable status quo.

In 2022-23, we solidified our position as an e-bike leader. We expanded our BIKETOWN for All Ambassador program, connecting more underserved individuals to affordable e-mobility. We introduced the Portland metro region's largest ride-to-own eBike program.

With your support, this program will provide 90 residents with free e-bikes. But we're not stopping there - we're providing riders with safety education, gear, and community support to speed our transition from car dependency to equitable mobility.

The years ahead promise more safety education, community events, and intensified advocacy as we launch new efforts and bring Clackamas County's Safe Routes To School program fully under our wing. We're gearing up for Oregon's critical 2025 legislative session, where our influence to secure funding for safer, complete streets and improved transit for Oregonians will be pivotal.

As we drive positive change in Oregon's transportation landscape, we rely on your support. **Ten** community listening sessions across three counties elevating the voices of **105** houseless (30), BIPOC, youth, and immigrant participants to help reduce pedestrian fatalities and increase investments for people walking, rolling, and riding transit.



During a driver education shortage, we increased by **50%** the number of Oregon Friendly Driver's classes, including one class for **120** driver's ed instructors.



We launched our **first** eBike library in our Lloyd Center Community HUB, with two ebikes funded in part by the HDR Foundation and Portland Clean Energy Fund.




